- ★ Make sure projects are delivered on time, on budget and to the right quality
- ★ Involved in all types of projects from houses to roads, bridges, and even theme parks!
- ★ Keep control of time, cost, quality and scope

## What are the Main Responsibilities?

- ★ Plan projects and manage budgets
- ★ Oversee site work to make sure things run smoothly
- ★ Work with project managers, site managers, architects, engineers & clients
- ★ Monitor quality and report progress to keep everyone up-to-date

# Did you Know?

### **Disneyland Paris started construction in** the late 1980s and opened on April 12,1992

- ★ Construction Managers had to plan and budget carefully, coordinating thousands of tradespeople
- ★ It was one of the most expensive theme parks ever built, costing around \$4.4 billion!
- ★ Today, over 16 million visitors enjoy the park every year
