- ★ Make sure buildings are delivered on time, on budget, and safely
- ★ Work with engineers, architects, contractors, and clients
- ★ Solve problems before they become big issues

What are the Main Responsibilities?

- ★ Work with clients to make sure the project is on track
- ★ Manage teams, budgets & timelines
- ★ Visit sites regularly to make sure all is running smoothly
- ★ Track progress and spending

The Burj Khalifa is the tallest building in the world with 163 floors!

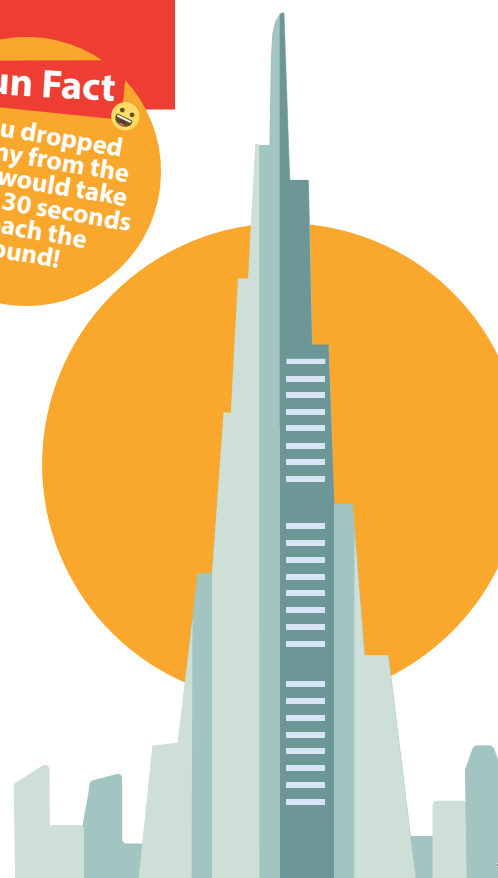
- ★ Construction took 6 years
